Information and Reservations:

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Sept. 8: Set Sail Anchorage (Seward). Seward is set on an inlet on the Kenai Peninsula. It's a gateway to Kenai Fjords National Park, where glaciers flow from the Harding Icefield into coastal fjords. Surrounded by peaks, the fjords are a whale and porpoise habitat. Enjoy incredible fresh seafood from the ships that return to Seward Harbor. The Alaska railway runs from Fairbanks through Denali National Park to Anchorage ending in Seward. The most spectacular scenery on this route is the last leg: Anchorage to Seward.



Sept. 9: Cruise South East Alaska.

Sept. 10: Glacier Bay.

Wake up to see frosted crags descend into mossy forests and a 457-meter-deep (1,500-foot-deep) fjord at this World Heritage Site, which is also one of the planet's largest biosphere reserves. Stone, ice and water continue to collide, sculpting a dramatic landscape that is the crown jewel of south-eastern Alaska's natural wonders.



Sept. 11: Skagway. The great Klondike Gold Rush lives on in Skagway's charming downtown of restored 19th-century buildings and its historic railway. Located on the edge of the wilderness, this small town saw its fair share of gold rush, get rich dreamers pass through. At one time it boasted 80 saloons and was known as the "roughest town on earth." The White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad runs the vintage locomotives through the famously steep Chilkoot Trail and offers sweeping mountain views during its climb toward Canada.

Sept. 12: Juneau. The capital of Alaska is a town accessible only by air and sea. Much of its independent frontier atmosphere remains particularly at the infamous and rowdy Red Dog Saloon. It has a superb location, snuggled between the flanks of 3,600-foot Mt. Juneau and the picturesque Gastineau Channel. Juneau is the gateway to the Mendenhall Glacier, a 12-mile river of ice that is Alaska's most accessible glacier. Or catch a floatplane to Admiralty Island to spy some bears lolling around.

Sept. 13: Ketchikan is the salmon capital of the world and a paradise for fishermen and nature-lovers alike. At every turn, you'll find yourself immersed in gold rush lore, from the infamous Red Onion Saloon that still keeps a pistol that Wyatt Earp left behind en route to the Klondike.
